

BIS Update: Mandatory Certification for Additional Products

Dear Reader,

We hope this email finds you well. We are writing to you with an important update regarding mandatory registration requirements applicable to imports of certain **Chemicals, Yarns and Sewing Machines** into India.

Background

Notification of Proposed Quality Control Orders at the WTO

The Government of India has on January 12, 2021 notified proposed Quality Control Orders for several chemicals and yarns at the World Trade Organization's Committee on Technical Barriers to Trade.

These are products for which mandatory BIS certification is being proposed. Upon their adoption, such Quality Control Orders will require products mentioned therein to meet the specifications contained in the standards formulated by the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), India's National Standardization Body, before they may be imported into India. Important to note the timelines for implementation

As per the notifications, WTO Members are invited to make comments, if any, within 60 days of issuance of the notifications. Concerned manufacturers of the chemicals mentioned above may, therefore, raise their concerns at the WTO level through their respective governments or with the abovementioned authorities within such time frames.

Once these Orders come into force, both foreign producers and domestic manufacturers of these products would need to submit an application to the BIS seeking certification. Furthermore, the process of certification will also require physical testing and inspection of the relevant chemicals at the factory premises as well as parallel testing by a BIS authorized laboratory in India to verify the same. Certification may be granted for a period of up to two years initially, after which it must be renewed

BIS certification is a time consuming process and therefore it is recommended that interested producers make applications for certification at the earliest in cases wherein Quality Control Orders are already in place.
